The PUD Christmas committee included Betty Zesiger, Wendy Manka, Lorraine Reynolds, Nancy Mains and Debi Svendsen.

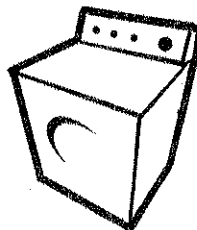
