

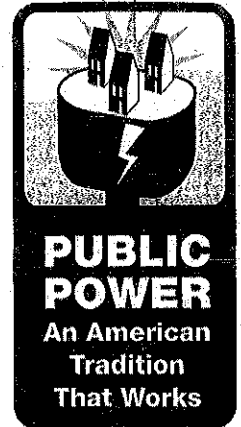

- **The Nation**

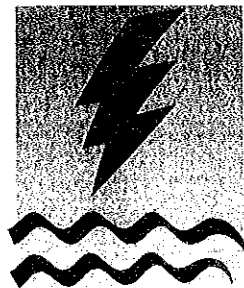
